

## PE Action Plan 2015/16

In 2016 the PE Tracker and the Whole School Assessment Tool will allow us to accurately measure progress in the following target areas:

- Improved attainment in PE
- Improved awareness of personal health and wellbeing within our school and community.
- Increased participation in extracurricular competitive school sport.
- An increase in the diversity of after school clubs in order to raise participation levels to at least 80%.
- Continue to prioritise staff professional development to ensure that all PE lessons are characterised by full engagement, high energy and enjoyment for all pupils. Skills are improved through good subject knowledge and teaching.
- PE lessons are fully resourced.
- Develop leadership opportunities for pupils throughout the school to increase leadership percentage above 20%.
