

PE End of Year Review

After School Clubs

This year we have dramatically increased the number of children participating in after school activities. In particular, after school provision for years 3 and 4 has increased from well below 50% to 90% of children in year 4 and 87% of children in Year 3 attending after school clubs in 2013/14.

Furthermore this year we have provided after school club opportunities for KS1. In the last academic year no children attended after school clubs in KS1. At the end of this academic year 60% of Year 2 children attend at least 1 after school club and 53% of Year 1 children attend at least 1 after school club.

Added to this we have increased the diversity of our after school clubs. We have provided tennis and dance clubs to complement our existing provision. Many more children throughout the school now attend more than 1 after school club. Many children attend 3 or more during the year.

We have continued to deliver our existing range of after school clubs which include Football, Rugby, Cricket, Gymnastics, Netball, Cross Country, Elite and Drama)

Curriculum Time

All children at Holy Trinity receive a minimum of 2 hours of PE each week.

This year all children have had an inspirational visit from a Paralympic Athlete and Healthy Lifestyle workshops with the Kick Theatre Company.

All children are given opportunities for **intra school competition**. This includes dance and gymnastic performances to classes and parents, as well as small sided competitive competitions in PE/ Games lessons. Children in Year 6 are given the opportunity to gain Gymnastic awards. This year we have also had a whole school Petanque competition and a World Cup inspired whole school penalty shootout.

Assessment and Tracking

This year we have put into place a formal method for tracking pupils PE progress and participation throughout the school. We are able to use the PE tracker to improve in the following ways:

1. Tracking children's progress in PE. We can identify specific groups where extra teaching/ intervention is needed year on year. We can provide support for weaker children in PE.
2. We can identify and track our most able children so that we can extend their learning and consider extra provision.
3. We can identify children who do not take part in after school clubs. We can target children whose health may be improved by increased participation.
4. We can identify and make provision for less active children in our school.
5. We can track the progress and participation of Pupil Premium and SEN children.
6. We can compare year on year the percentage of children from each class who take part in an after school club, who take on leadership responsibility, who are involved in inter and intra school competition.

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Inter School Competition

We continue to provide a busy calendar of inter school competitive sport. Our on-going aim is to sustain and increase opportunities for all children within the school to experience Inter School Competition. Fixtures attended in 2014:

Active Play and Leadership

This year we have purchased a variety of active play equipment for the children to use at break times. **Active Play leaders** from Year 5 and 6 have been responsible for distributing and organising play equipment to KS1 and KS2 each day. Active Play leaders have been involved in suggesting games and equipment as well as giving guidance to younger children on how to play and use the equipment correctly. This year we have also introduced two new basketball hoops for use at break times. This gives the children an extra active break time opportunity to go along with the activity equipment and football.

PE Equipment

This year our PE resources have been enhanced with the purchase of whole class sets of equipment and targeted resources to improve teaching.
