
We now look forward to cheering them on in the final against St George's Primary School. Well done to all the players – you've made us all very proud!

Operation Pond is Underway!

Last Friday marked an exciting milestone as small but enthusiastic group of children, teachers, parents, governors and grandparents came together to tackle the first stage of this ambitious project and begin transforming our beautiful but underused pond area.

Our vision is to create a spiritual haven and outdoor learning zone that will benefit the whole school community whilst supporting the environment. The potential for impact across curriculum areas and pupil wellbeing is truly endless.

Stage 1 focused on de-weeding and tidying the area so we could assess what we're working with. As you can see from the before and after pictures, the transformation achieved in just one hour was remarkable!

The next stage is harder – and more expensive. We are hoping to raise £5,000 to create a space that is safe, sustainable and accessible for all children. This will enable us to install proper pathways, seating areas, and educational features that will make the pond a valuable resource for outdoor learning across all year groups.
