Year 1's Great Fire of London Adventure

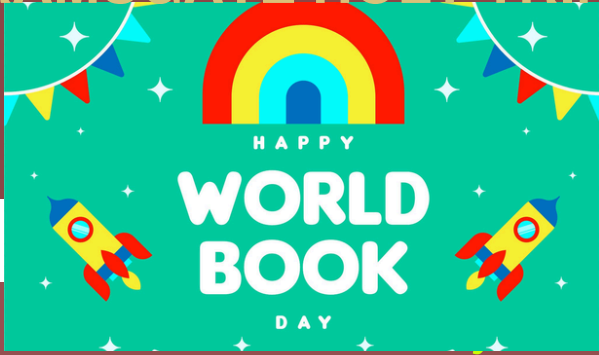


Class 1 have been time-travelling back to 1666, discovering how a fire in Thomas Farriner's bakery spread across London!

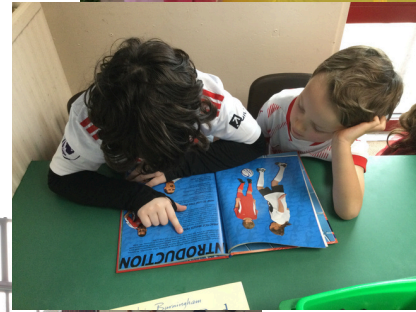
