Summer Reading Challenge

Reading Games:

1. How many words can you skim and scan in 1 minute?
2. How many words can you read in 1 minute? Try and beat your score each time.
3. Ask an adult to ask you 10 questions about the text you have just read (remember: when answering, use the text for evidence).
4. What is the meaning of the word? Can you name a synonym? Can you name an antonym? Is it a verb/adverb/preposition/noun/adjective?

Maths Skills:

Remember: cooking, games and problem solving can be a great way to practise!

- All times tables (with inverse)
- Number bonds up to 1000
- Place value including negative numbers to thousandths
- Addition, subtraction, division and multiplication
- Square, cube and prime numbers
- Perimeter and area of a rectilinear shape
- Converting measurement

English and Handwriting Skills:

Activities to choose from:

Please note: all activities are to be HANDWRITTEN and a ruler is used for EVERY straight line.

(1) Keep a diary

Features:

- Date
- 1st person
- Express feelings and thoughts
- Non-negotiables
- Reported speech only (For example: He said that ...)
- Commas, ellipses, exclamation and question marks
- Punctuation Challenge: colons, semicolons and parenthesis (brackets, hyphens or commas indicating additional information)

(2) Create a cookbook

Features:

- Heading and subheadings
- Each recipe should have:
 - Ingredients with measurements and step by step guide how to cook the food (this is called a method)
- Evaluation of your cooking
- Picture of your cooking
- Score out of 10

(3) Write your own story

Features:

- Main title and chapter titles
- Chapters
- Paragraphs
- One illustration per chapter
- Non-negotiables
- Commas, colons, semicolons, exclamation and question marks
- Direct speech
- Remain in the same tense throughout
