Activity: Verb tenses – present and past

Remember:

We use the present tense to write about things that are happening now. When we write about things that happened earlier, we write in the past tense.

Present tense: I am writing a story.
Past tense: I wrote a story yesterday.

Write the following verbs in the present and past tense. The first one has been done for you.

Extension:

<u>Sometimes</u> the past tense can be formed by putting the suffix 'ed' onto the end of the present tense. For example, look becomes looked. Nevertheless, you can't always do this!

Put a cross next to the verbs (above) where you cannot add the suffix 'ed' onto the end.
