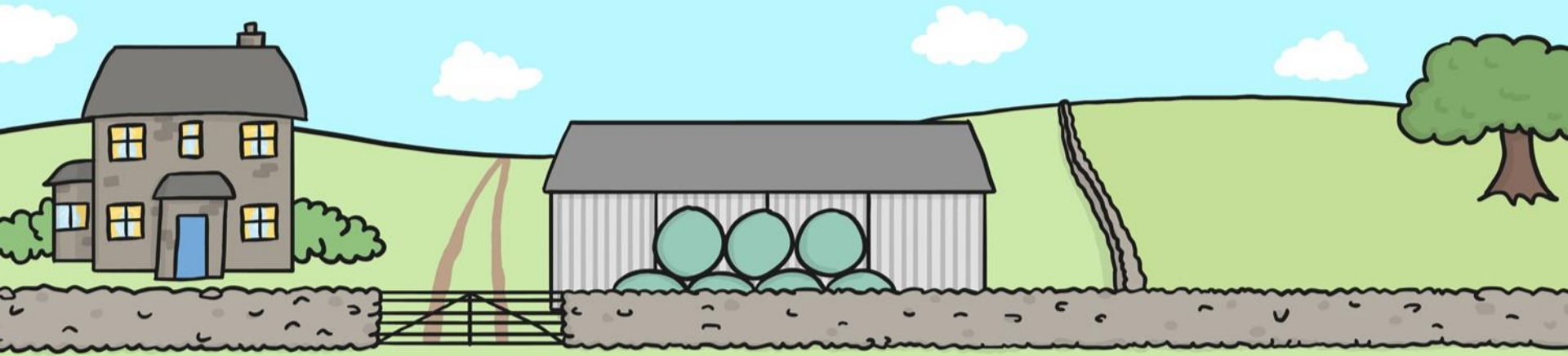
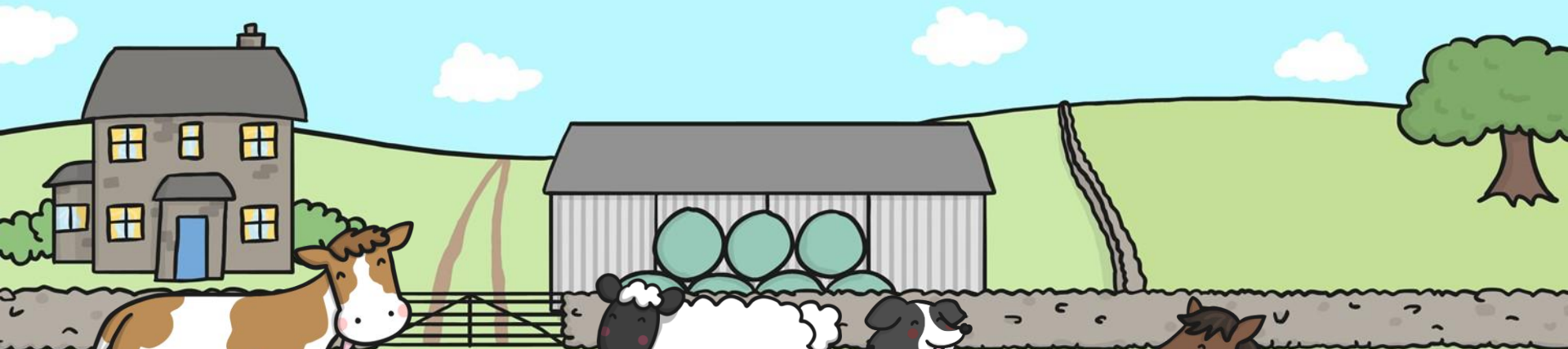


Animals on the Farm

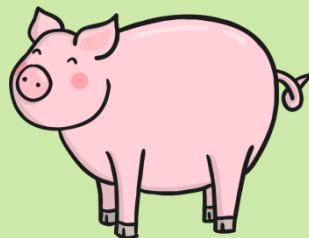
Sheep and sheepdogs
